

The TRAGIC project is for all Canadian teachers who oppose exposing children of any age to the harms of gender ideology through mandated curriculums. We believe biological sex is binary, not a spectrum, and that children should not be taught any information to the contrary. We oppose normalizing gender dysphoria as well as the deliberate confusion caused by presenting gender ideology to children before they are able to understand the immutability of biological sex. We do not believe children can be 'born in the wrong body' and support inquiry into the student's mental health, history, and home circumstances if identity is questioned. We do not support 'affirmative' therapy, instead encouraging 'watchful waiting,' and oppose lifelong medicalization, mutilation, and sterilization. We do not believe schools should have the power to withhold information about children from parents or that school is the only 'safe space' for a child questioning their identity. We support protecting girls' dignity through sex-based changing spaces and washrooms, safety through sex-based sports, and sex-based academic opportunities. We believe in protecting freedom of speech and do not support coerced speech through pronouns and other 'validation' terminology. We believe sexual orientation is innate and oppose the conversion therapy of 'transing' gay children. We encourage a critical approach to gender stereotypes present in society through roles, clothing, hairstyles, and behaviour.
